STAT-MD

Recently, there has been an increase in the number of diverts without crews contacting STAT-MD. Per the FOM, crews are reminded they should contact STAT-MD before initiating an air return or diverting for a medical event. Ensure that STAT-MD is aware of ETA to destination and divert airport options. Re-consult STAT-MD if there is a change in the

passenger's medical condition that might alter the prior STAT-MD divert/continue recommendation.

Global Entry Interviews Available

Global Entry is a "Trusted Traveler" program run by the US Customs and Border Protection Service (CBP) that allows pre-approved, low-risk travelers expedited entry back into the US. After getting Global Entry members to can register their "Trusted Traveler" number and then also be approved for the TSA Pre-Check program.

We are attempting to determine if there is enough interest within the MSP pilot and F/A bases to support having CBP set up an expedited interview process in our spaces. We need a minimum number of applicants for CBP to allocate the resources, so if you believe you would be interested please contact the MSP CPO admin staff and advise them (note: spouses and other family members may use this process as well). Interviews would likely occur in October or perhaps November. Currently, interviews in MSP obtained through normal channels are running five to six months out from application.

TCAS RAs and MSP

Recent ASAP reports and FOQA data have shown an increase in RAs in the MSP airport terminal area. Recent fleet bulletins state: "Most but not all, of the increase is due to close parallel runway operations at high density airports."

While there is an emphasis on "most", MSP has recently seen a small number of events where the offending aircraft was not on approach for the parallel runway but rather a secondary aircraft skirting the Class B near the approach corridor. Remember that the latest policy change only allows a crew to disregard the RA when ALL of the following conditions exist: Daytime, VMC, radar contact, parallel approach operations, cleared for the approach, and the traffic can be immediately and positively identified and separation can be maintained.

Except as specifically noted above, pilots are required to immediately comply with an RA. Also, remember that after receiving an RA, selection of "TA Only" is not recommended. Maintaining TCAS RA guidance is desirable in the event of a go-around and/or secondary intruder aircraft. As always, an ASR is required per FOM, chapter 10, for all TCAS RAs.

Our Bag Rooms Are Moving

As of Thursday September 8th please note that our bag storage room under the F concourse will be moving. ACS will be converting that space into offices. We have acquired a new space. The office attached to our Pilot lounge (under F) will be modified to become the new storage area. It is immediately to your left as you enter the lounge, currently used by ACS for service recovery. The door will be removed and shelving units installed. No action needed on your part, all bags will be relocated.

Additionally we will close the F2 bag storage room (concourse level). All items will be relocated to the current F5 bag storage room (concourse level). We've asked they install more hanging shelves. Again, no action needed on your part. This move date is still TBD.

ALPA Air Safety Award

The 2015 ALPA Air Safety Award, the highest honor bestowed upon an ALPA Safety volunteer, was presented to First Officer John Klinger at the 62nd annual ALPA Air Safety Forum in Washington DC. John has been advancing ALPA safety interests for two decades. Following the DAL/NWA merger in 2008, John served the Flight Operations Integration Analysis Team - heralded as an industry model on how to integrate two complex and vastly differing airline operations. Through his efforts as a FOQA gatekeeper, he sought ways to integrate the voluntary safety reporting program with ASAP, demonstrating what the industry can achieve when there is a positive, collaborative approach from all parties. John was recently hired into the MSP Chief Pilot office as an Assistant Chief Pilot. Congratulations to John and his family for this well-deserved recognition.
